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INTRODUCTION

At the same time, information is a resource that expands human capabilities, reveals new ways of social development, creates conditions for a comfortable life and economic growth. Today, the advantage is gained by someone who knows how to work with information, evaluate various information from the point of view of their reliability, objectivity, completeness, relevance, importance, and also create their own information.

The academic discipline "International information" is devoted to the most urgent issues of management and use of information and information and communication technologies in modern international economic relations.

The academic discipline "International Information" is a selective academic discipline and is studied in accordance with the curriculum for training specialists of the "bachelor" educational level, specialty 292 "International Economic Relations", educational and professional program "International Business" of all forms of education.

The purpose of teaching the academic discipline "International Information" is to provide knowledge about the methodology and specific technologies of information and analytical activity in the field of international economic relations, methods and forms of searching, obtaining, accumulating, primary processing and deep transformation of relevant information.

The main tasks of studying the discipline "International Information" are:

to form a clear idea and understanding of the essence of international information, its role in modern international economic relations;

providing applicants with the basics of forecasting and modeling international economic relations, accumulating skills in planning foreign economic activity.

The object of study of the academic discipline is information about events and phenomena in the field of international economic relations.

The subject of study of the academic discipline is the main provisions of the information and analytical activity of specialists in international economic relations.

The concept of "Public Relations". Two components of PR. Public Relations as a management function and its relationship with marketing and branding. Basic goals in the field of PR activities. Differences between PR and propaganda. "Soft" power of countries. Formation of mass media of the country's reputation in the international arena. Prospects for the formation of the public sphere in Ukraine. The concept of "public media" and its examples. Methods of studying communication campaigns.

TEACHING METHODS

In the process of teaching an educational discipline, in order to acquire certain learning outcomes, to activate the educational process, it is envisaged to use such learning methods as:

Verbal (lecture (Topics 1 – 3, 5, 6, 8), mini-lectures (Topics 4, 7), problem lectures (Topics 6, 8, 9, 10)).

In person (demonstration (Topics 1 – 10)).

Practical (practical work (Topics 1, 3, 5, 9, 10), laboratory work (Topics 2, 4, 6, 7, 8), seminars (Topics 1, 6, 8), seminar-discussions (Topics 2, 7).

FORMS AND METHODS OF ASSESSMENT

The University uses a 100-point cumulative system for assessing the learning outcomes of students.

Current control is carried out during lectures, practical, laboratory and seminar classes and is aimed at checking the level of readiness of the student to perform a specific job and is evaluated by the amount of points scored:

– for courses with a form of semester control as an exam: maximum amount is 60 points; minimum amount required is 35 points.

The final control includes current control and an exam.

Semester control is carried out in the form of a semester exam or grading.

The final grade in the course is determined:

– for disciplines with a form of exam, the final grade is the amount of all points received during the current control and the exam grade.

During the teaching of the course, the following control measures are used: c discipline, the following control measures are used:

Current control: active work in pairs (12 points), survey (8 points), current control works (10 points), homework (7 points), creative task (6 points), essay writing (10 points), colloquium (7 points).

Semester control: Grading including Exam (40 points).

Evaluation criteria

The final marks for the exam consist of the sum of the marks for the completion of all tasks, rounded to a whole number according to the rules of mathematics.

The algorithm for solving each task includes separate stages that differ in complexity, time-consumingness, and importance for solving the task. Therefore, individual tasks and stages of their solution are evaluated separately from each other as follows:

Task 1 (stereotype). (5 points)

0.5 points for a correct answer to the test task

Task 2 (stereotype). (4 points)

Evaluation depends on the correctness of the established correspondence between the term and its definition.

Task 3 (diagnostic). (8 points)

Evaluation depends on the correctness of the given examples of types of information.

5 points – examples of types of information are given;

3 points - types of information are detailed.

Task 4 (diagnostic). (9 points)

Evaluation depends on the completeness of the answer.

5 points – types of information are correctly disclosed;

4 points – sources of information are correctly disclosed.

Task 5 (diagnostic). (12 points)

Evaluation depends on the completeness and reasonableness of the answer.

5 points – the topic of the short essay is revealed;

7 points – the topic is substantiated and proven.
